Biodiversity and sustainable development go hand in hand

The CEBioS programme at the Royal Belgian Institute of Natural Sciences (RBINS) promotes capacity building in developing countries for the conservation, management and sustainable use of biodiversity, its ecosystem services and the link to poverty reduction. Interventions include research. training, mainstreaming. dissemination, awareness raising, and policy advice. Capacity building on the Clearing House Mechanism (web-based information dissemination network) in national focal points for biodiversity and

in the context of the Global Taxonomy Initiative (GTI) is undertaken under the umbrella of the Rio Convention on Biological Diversity. CEBioS is involved in institutional strengthening with selected partners in nature conservation.

The programme is funded by DGD (Belgian Development Cooperation), as part of the implementation of the Aichi targets, the EU biodiversity strategy to 2020 and the Belgian biodiversity strategy 2020.
