







How does **CEBioS** • function?

Eligibility criteria

Relevance to development, poverty alleviation, track record, partner country, scientific level, relevance to biodiversity

Interventions

- 1. Calls for grants for training, research
 - Open under the eligibility criteria
 - Competitive
 - 1 call/year: for scientists of RBINS→South
 - 1 call/year: from Southern scientists → Belgium
- 2. Calls for in situ projects
 - Long-term commitment through multi-annual projects
 - Open under the eligibility criteria
 - Competitive
 - 1 call/year for CHM reinforcement
 - 1 call/year for awareness raising
- 3. Calls for Measurement, Reporting and Verification (MRV)
 - Based on AICHI targets in National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans
 - open under eligibility criteria
 - Competitive
 - 1 call/year
- 4. Institutional partnerships
- 5. Publications
- 6. Setting-up of national web sites
- 7. Workshops in South or in North




CEBioS' interventions in RD Congo

- Institutional partnerships in RD Congo, with WWF, ERAIFT, ICCN, Botanic Garden Meise and RMCA on national parks and protected areas in cooperation with universities (UNILU, Goma, Bukavu, UNIKIN):
 - Parc National de Virunga (mushrooms, "réseau des mycologues"...)
 - Itombwe, Luswishi, Parc Marin des Mangroves
 - Uvira, fisheries, Ruzizi
 - Training and capacity development at "Centre de Surveillance de la Biodiversité" (CSB/UNIKIS) (secondary CHM, research, MRV, scientific communication...)
- Training & Lexica about habitats and conservation:
 - Parc National de Kahuzi-Biega
 - Bombo Lumene
- Digitalisation of the archives of the "Institut des Parcs Nationaux du Congo-Belge"
- **CHM partnership**: hosting of national CHM, training of CHM contributors
- Awareness projects, e.g. cooperation with VVOB in pilot schools
